Life and time: Portraits by Rod McNicol will feature 20 photographic portraits spanning McNicol's decades long career. The portraits are of people from Rod's own life: his friends, and members of his social world.

Born in 1946, Australian photographer Rod McNicol has consistently analysed the passing of time through the evidence of the photographic portrait. At once confronting and tender, McNicol's portrait photographs are bold and intimate.

McNicol founded The Photographers Gallery in South Yarra Melbourne in 1975 and has been a prominent figure in the Melbourne photographic scene for many decades. He was awarded the Portrait Gallery's *National Photographic Portrait Prize* in 2012 for his portrait of Indigenous actor Jack Charles.

Life and time: Portraits by Rod McNicol will be on display at the National Portrait Gallery, Canberra, until 23 August 2015.
